- (2) (a) requested the Privileges and Procedures Committee to prepare and lodge amendments to Standing Orders to give effect to paragraph (1) above; and
- (b) requested the Bailiff to issue guidance on the discretion which might be exercised by the Presiding Officer under paragraphs (1)(b) and (c) above, following consultation on that guidance with the Privileges and Procedures Committee.
