Explanatory Note regarding subordinate legislation tabled at this meeting.

R & O 100/2001

The purpose of this Order is to revoke the foot-and-mouth restrictions in respect of France and the Republic of Ireland.

It also amends the restrictions on the importation of certain animals and items from other British Islands to ensure that restricted animals and items cannot be imported from those islands through other places.

It also adds four more beaches on which dogs may be exercised unleashed.

Finally it consolidates the Orders relating to foot-and-mouth disease restrictions (except the one relating to Holland).

The Order was made on 20th June 2001 and came into force forthwith.

R & O 101/2001

The purpose of this Order is to amend the restrictions on the importation of certain animals and items from Holland to take account of the fact that the restrictions on importing animals and items from France are to be lifted.

The Order was made on 22nd June 2001 and came into force on 24th June 2001.

QUESTION PAPER

Deputy G.L.C. Baudains of St. Clement will ask the following question of the President of the Public Services Committee -

“Would the President advise members -

- (a) which bodies the Committee consults before reaching conclusions regarding extending pavements and altering traffic flows?
- (b) what progress the Committee has made on the Sustainable Transport Strategy, and when it will be coming to this Assembly with proposals for the implementation of the Transport Strategy (P.60/99) which was adopted by the States on 29th June 1999?
- (c) why the Committee has not brought a proposition to enable approval of the far-reaching changes being made to pavements and traffic flows by the Committee in conjunction with the Urban Renewal Sub-Committee, (of which the President is Chairman)?”

Deputy G.L.C. Baudains of St. Clement will ask the following questions of the President of the Planning and Environment Committee -

“1. Would the President -

- (a) state whether the decisions of the Urban Renewal Sub-Committee are normally submitted to the full Committee for endorsement?
- (b) advise members of the Sub-Committee’s remit?

2. Would the President -

- (a) confirm that the Urban Renewal Sub-Committee has £500,000 at its disposal per year?
- (b) advise what major projects this money has been spent on in the last three years?
- (c) state how the various projects are prioritised?

3. Would the President advise whether the Sub-Committee’s work is limited to St. Helier, or whether it can operate in other parishes? If the answer is affirmative to the latter, would the President advise what percentage of the £500,000 has been spent in St. Helier in each of the last three years?

4. With regard to the road alterations involving Union Street, York Street, Charing Cross, the Parade, Dumaresq Street, Conway Street, New Cut and Broad Street, would the President -

- (a) advise what benefits were anticipated from these alterations?
- (b) advise members whether one of the main purposes

of these alterations is to restrict the movement of cars into town?

- (c) agree that the public have not been kept fully informed, and that the 'roadshow' type presentation to the public did not meet the aims of the 'Street Life Programme', issued by the Committee in conjunction with Public Services Committee, which states that 'At each stage, information will be published about the details of the plan, and members of the public will be kept fully informed'?
 - (d) would he agree that the traffic alterations in question have not been a success to date, and will he therefore revert the traffic flows to their original format?"
5. In view of the chaos that has ensued as a result of traffic alterations in Union Street, York Street, etc., would the President agree that in future wider consultation is needed, involving more than just those living or working nearby, and therefore undertake to publish the current plans in full in the media? Would he also ensure that any future plans are similarly published, so that the public generally, and motorists in particular, have sufficient advance warning, not only to express their views, but also to enable them to understand what is happening?"

Deputy C.J. Scott Warren of St. Saviour will ask the following question of the President of the Education Committee -

"Can the President give details of the number of vacancies for teachers in the public and private sector schools that have been advertised during 2000 and 2001 and would he give a break down for each year as follows -

- (a) the number of applicants from the United Kingdom for teaching posts in Jersey in 2000 and 2001?
- (b) the number in (a) who came to Jersey for interview?
- (c) the number of those attending interviews in (b) who were offered posts?
- (d) the number of those attending interviews in Jersey who have -
 - (i) been offered posts who have accepted them?
 - (ii) the number who declined an offer of employment?
- (e) the number of posts which include a subsidy for housing, for rental or purchase?
- (f) the annual housing subsidy to Education Committee employees in -
 - (i) 1996; 1997; 1998; 1999; 2000?
 - (ii) an estimate for 2001?"

Deputy P.F.C. Ozouf of St. Helier will ask the following questions of the President of the Agriculture and Fisheries Committee -

- “1. Would the President inform the Assembly on progress of completing the new agricultural strategy. Specifically when the Committee intends lodging and seeking a States debate and, if after the summer recess, the reason for the delay?”
2. Would the President inform the Assembly what the range of financial implications for the States are?
3. Would the President explain the latest position with regard to the status of the Growers Association including whether management and staff have been appointed and whether any public funds have been paid or promised to the Association?
4. Is the Committee intending to bring a proposition under the Agricultural Marketing (Jersey) Law 1953 ? If so, why?”
