Explanatory Note regarding subordinate legislation tabled at this meeting.

R & O 181/2001

This Order increases the fee for the cremation for a person above the age of seventeen years from £159 to £162. There is no fee for the cremation of a person below that age.

The maximum fee chargeable by a registered medical practitioner for completing a required medical certificate is increased from £37 to £39.

The Order was made on 7th December 2001 and comes into force on 1st January 2002.

R & O 182/2001

The purpose of this Order is to increase from £80 to £82 the application fee for an annual licence to use a vehicle or stall for the sale or preparation for sale of ice-cream.

The Order was made on 7th December 2001 and comes into force on 1st January 2002.

R & O 183/2001

This Order increases the fees payable in respect of the registration of ancillary dental workers.

The fee payable on first enrolment, and on restoration to the roll, is increased from £35.00 to £35.50.

The fee payable for retention on the roll is increased from £20.50 to £21.00. The fees were last increased on 1st January 2001.

The Order was made on 7th December 2001, and comes into force on 1st January 2002.

R & O 184/2001

The purpose of this Order is to increase the fees payable in respect of the licensing of nursing agencies. The fee payable on a first application for a licence is increased from £194 to £198. The fee payable for renewal of a licence is increased from £96 to £98. The fee payable on transfer of a licence to different premises is increased from £76.50 to £78.00. The fees were last increased on 1st January 2001.

The Order was made on 7th December 2001 and comes into force on 1st January 2002.

R & O 185/2001

This Order increases the fee payable by a person in charge of a residential home on first registration from £57 to £58, and the annual fee payable by a person carrying on a home from £67.50 to £69.

The Order was made on 7th December 2001 and comes into force on 1st January 2002.

R & O 186/2001

This Order increases the fee payable by a person in charge of a nursing home or mental nursing home on first registration from £57 to £58, and the annual fee by a person carrying on a home from £67.50 to £69.

The Order was made on 7th December 2001 and comes into force on 1st January 2002.

R & O 187/2001

The purpose of this Order is to prescribe matters relating to driving licences and the driving test. It replaces the existing Order but makes no substantial change of policy.

The Order was made on 10th December 2001 and comes into force on 1st January 2002.
