## **Explanatory Note regarding subordinate legislation tabled at this meeting.**

### **R&O.171/2008.**

This Order increases, with effect from 1st January 2009, fees payable under the legislation for which the Minister for Planning and Environment has responsibility. They are as follows –

- (a) the fee for a licence under the Dangerous Wild Animals (Jersey) Law 1999 is increased from £200 to £250; the fee has not been increased since 1999;
- (b) the fees for licences under the Animal Welfare (Jersey) Law 2004 are increased by 2.5%; the fees were last increased on 28th February 2008; there is an exception for the fee for a licence for an animal sanctuary, which is reduced;
- (c) the fees payable for licences, registration and consignment notes under the Waste Management (Jersey) Law 2005 are increased by 2.5%; the fees were last increased on 22nd July 2008;
- (d) the fees payable for planning applications and building permission applications under the Planning and Building (Jersey) Law 2002 are revised and increased, in the case of small works and small developments, by 2.5%; the fees were last increased on 1st March 2008; a new, higher range of fees is introduced for commercial ventures (relating to 5 dwellings or more) as outlined in the Annual Business Plan 2009;
- (e) the fee payable for an application under the High Hedges (Jersey) Law 2008 is increased by 2.57%; the fee was first set on 11th January 2008.

The Order was made on 12th December 2008 and comes into force on 1st January 2009.
