Road Traffic (Public Parking Places – Charges) (Amendment No. 3) (Jersey) Order 2019.

This Order amends the Road Traffic (Public Parking Places – Charges) (Jersey) Order 2017 to increase the charges for parking in public parking places in line with the retail prices index September 2017 figure, being 3.7%.

The Order was made on 22nd February 2019 and comes into force on 1st March 2019.

Road Traffic (Speed Limits) (Amendment No. 11) (Jersey) Order 2019.

This Order amends the Schedules to the Road Traffic (Speed Limits) (Jersey) Order 2003 (“2003 Order”) for the purpose of changing the speed limits which apply to various roads in the parishes of Grouville and St. Helier.

Article 1 is an interpretation provision.

By *Article 2*, Schedule 1 to the 2003 Order is amended to replace the list of roads in the parish of Grouville that are subject to a 30 mph speed limit.

By *Article 3*, Schedule 2 to the 2003 Order is amended to replace the lists of roads in the parishes of Grouville and St. Helier that are subject to a 20 mph speed limit.

By *Article 4*, Schedule 3 to the 2003 Order is amended to replace the list of roads in the parish of Grouville that are subject to a 15 mph speed limit.

Article 5 gives the title of this Order and provides for it to come into force 7 days after the day on which it is made.

The Order was made on 22nd February 2019 and comes into force on 1st March 2019.
