Covid-19 (Workplace Restrictions and Gathering Control) (Amendment No. 7) (Jersey) Order 2021.
Minister for Health and Social Services.

This Order further relaxes the restrictions imposed to control the spread of Covid-19 in Jersey while extending the contact tracing requirements and making a few minor changes.

Article 1 provides that *Articles 2 to 6* amend the Covid-19 (Workplace Restrictions) (Jersey) Order 2020 (the “2020 Order”).

Article 2 removes some redundant definitions from the 2020 Order.

Article 3 amends *Article 5* of the 2020 Order to remove the requirements on visitors to workplaces to wear masks except in the case of public transport vehicles and premises.

Article 4 amends *Article 5A* of the 2020 Order to provide for the removal of the requirements for workers to wear masks or visors except in the case of public transport vehicles and premises.

Article 5 extends the contact tracing requirements in *Article 5B* of the 2020 Order to apply to ritual gatherings of whatever size and various gatherings in community halls.

Article 6 extends the category of enforcement officer to cover all States’ employees employed as enforcement officers within the Covid Safe team.

Article 7 amends the Covid-19 (Gathering Control) (Jersey) Order 2020 to remove the restriction on numbers in the case of a wedding or civil partnership celebration taking place at a person’s home.

Article 8 provides for how the Order may be cited and for it to come into force on 14th June 2021.

Road Traffic (St. Clement) (Amendment No. 25) (Jersey) Order 2021.
Minister for Infrastructure.

This Order amends the Road Traffic (St. Clement) (Jersey) Order 1987 in relation to the parking of vehicles in La Grande Route de St. Clement, La Rue de la Croix and La Grève d’Azette; restricting vehicles wider than 6 feet and 6 inches from being driven in specified roads and making various drafting changes by way of clarification and minor improvements.

Selection of the Minister for Children and Education and of the Minister for Home Affairs

The Presiding Officer will invite the Chief Minister to make his nomination for the position of Minister for Children and Education. The Presiding Officer will then invite members to nominate alternative candidates. If there are no alternative nominations, the member nominated by the Chief Minister will speak for up to 10 minutes followed by a 20-minute question period; after which the member nominated by the Chief Minister will be selected for appointment.

If more than one member is nominated, the Presiding Officer will invite each candidate to speak for up to 10 minutes followed by a 20-minute question period. The candidates will speak in the order in which they are nominated, meaning that the Chief Minister's nominee will speak first. During the speeches and question periods other candidates must withdraw from the Chamber to a place where they cannot hear the proceedings. After all the candidates have spoken and been questioned, a recorded vote will be held. Once a candidate has obtained a majority of the votes cast in the recorded vote, he or she will be appointed to the position of Minister for Children and Education. Abstentions do not count as 'votes cast'.

Once a Minister for Children and Education has been appointed, this process will be repeated for the appointment of a Minister for Home Affairs.

In accordance with Standing Order 117(2A), the Chief Minister has declared his intended nominations to be Deputy S.M. Wickenden of St. Helier for the position of Minister for Children and Education and Deputy G.C.U. Guida of St. Lawrence for the position of Minister for Home Affairs. If the Chief Minister's nominee for Minister for Children and Education were not appointed, Standing Order 117 would allow the Chief Minister to amend his nomination for the position of Minister for Home Affairs, if he so wished.

- (a) the costs per copy of all photocopying in each school for each year between 2016 and 2020;
- (b) the number of copies produced by each school for each year between 2016 and 2020;



- (c) the reasons behind the reduction in photocopying expenditure for D'Hautrée House School (Special Needs) from £2,115 in 2019 to £3 in 2020 and the impact, if any, of this reduction in copying on the provision for the children concerned; and
 - (d) how the deficits incurred by the secondary schools between 2016 and 2020 have been financed, and what measures, if any, are being taken to ensure that they have sufficient funds to avoid similar deficits occurring in the future?
34. The Minister for Economic Development, Tourism, Sport and Culture tabled an answer on 28th June 2021 to the following question asked by Deputy M.R. Higgins of St. Helier –

“Further to the response to Written Question 274/2021, will the Minister advise –

- (a) what cost-benefit analysis has been undertaken, if any, of the role of High Value Residents and the effect that they have on the Jersey economy, other than directly through tax income; and
 - (b) whether any empirical evidence exists in relation to the impact, both positive and negative, of the Government’s High Value Resident policy regime and, if so, what that evidence is?”
35. The Minister for the Environment tabled an answer on 28th June 2021 to the following question asked by the Connétable of St. Martin –

“With reference to Written Question 29/2021 will the Minister advise –

- (a) whether criteria required to be met for the granting of licences for commercial cultivation of medicinal cannabis will be published, including the use of Environmental Impact Assessments (E.I.A.s);
 - (b) how many E.I.A.s have been carried out to date for this purpose, if any, and how many are scheduled to be undertaken before 31st December 2021;
 - (c) on what date, and by whom, the decision was taken to include the requirement to undertake an E.I.A. in order to receive a licence and, if this occurred prior to 8th February 2021, why this was not communicated in the answer to Written Question 29/2021;
 - (d) what consideration was given to the use of E.I.A.s in the licensing process prior to 11th January 2021, and what relevant policies and criteria, if any, relating to this subject were agreed prior to that date; and
 - (e) if the use of E.I.A.s was agreed after 11th January 2021, whether licenses for the commercial cultivation of medicinal cannabis were suspended until an E.I.A. had been carried out?”
36. The Minister for the Environment tabled an answer on 28th June 2021 to the following question asked by the Connétable of St. Martin –

“Will the Minister advise –

- (a) whether Environmental Impact Assessments (E.I.A.s) required to be undertaken for the granting of commercial cannabis cultivation licences take into account the material change of use, or operational development, of the land used to cultivate medicinal cannabis on a commercial scale;
- (b) what consideration, if any, has been given within such E.I.A.s to the impact of noise, smell and transport on the surrounding area; and



- (c) how firms awarded licences following the successful completion of such E.I.A.s are monitored to ensure that they continue to comply with the findings of the E.I.A., and whether further E.I.A.s are due to be required whilst medicinal cannabis is subsequently being commercially cultivated?”

37. The Minister for the Environment tabled an answer on 28th June 2021 to the following question asked by the Connétable of St. Martin –

“With regards to the licensing conditions associated with the cultivation and processing of medicinal cannabis on Island, will the Minister advise –

- (a) what consideration has been given to the use of increased public consultation for Islanders living near selected sites for the cultivation of medicinal cannabis;
- (b) what steps will be taken by the Government of Jersey, whether individually or in conjunction with organisations involved in the commercial cultivation of medicinal cannabis, to alleviate the concerns of Islanders in close proximity to these sites; and
- (c) what guidance has been sought by the Government of Jersey from the U.K.’s Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs regarding the use of Environmental Impact Assessments as a condition of licensing?”
