R&O.10/2024.

Changes to Ministerial Offices (Jersey) Amendment Order 2024.

Chief Minister.

This Order:

- renames the Minister for Children and Education as the Minister for Children and Families;
- establishes the Minister for Education and Lifelong Learning and transfers some of the functions of the Minister for Children and Families to the Minister for Education and Lifelong Learning;
- renames the Minister for Housing and Communities as the Minister for Housing; and
- transfers financial services functions from the Chief Minister to the Minister for External Relations.

Article 1 amends the States of Jersey (Ministerial Offices) Order 2022 (the “Ministerial Offices Order”) to rename the Minister for Children and Education as the Minister for Children and Families. It also introduces *Schedule 1*, which amends other legislation to reflect the new name of the Ministerial Office in relation to the functions that are being retained by that Office.

Article 2 amends the Ministerial Offices Order to establish the Minister for Education and Lifelong Learning. It also introduces *Schedule 2*, which amends other legislation to transfer some of the functions of the Minister for Children and Families to the Minister for Education and Lifelong Learning.

Article 3 amends the Ministerial Offices Order to rename the Minister for Housing and Communities as the Minister for Housing. It also introduces *Schedule 3*, which amends other legislation to reflect the new name of the Ministerial Office.

Article 4 introduces *Schedule 4*, which amends legislation to transfer financial services functions from the Chief Minister to the Minister for External Relations.

Article 5 gives the title of this Order and states that it comes into force at 9.30 a.m. on 27th February 2024. The Order was made on 27th February 2024 and came into force at 9.30 a.m. on the same day.

Tourism (General Provisions) (Jersey) Amendment Order 2024.

Minister for Sustainable Economic Development.

This Order amends the Tourism (General Provisions) (Jersey) Order 1990. The amendments remove the minimum size requirements for –

- bedrooms, beds, corridors and both private and shared bathrooms, shower rooms, baths, showers and wash basins in hotels;
- bedrooms, beds and shared bathrooms, shower rooms, baths, showers and wash basins in guest houses; and
- accommodation, rooms for sleeping, bathrooms, shower rooms, baths, showers, wash basins, living rooms and kitchens in self-catering accommodation.

This Order comes into force 7 days after it is made.

The Order was made on 7th March 2024 and came into force on 14th March 2024.

Employment (Amendment No. 14) (Jersey) Commencement Order 2024.

Minister for Social Security.

This Order brings the Employment (Amendment No. 14) (Jersey) Law 2023 (the “Law”) into force on 18th March 2024. The Law makes provision for parental bereavement leave.

The Order was made on 13th March 2024 and came into force on the same day.

“Will the Chief Minister detail which specific incentives and regulations he considers essential to support Jersey achieving a 68% carbon reduction by 2030 and fulfilling its international obligations?”

4. The Minister for the Environment tabled an answer on 4th March 2024 to the following question asked by Deputy J. Renouf of St. Brelade –

“Will the Minister outline his proposed timetable to regulate hospital and ambulance services under the Regulation of Care (Jersey) Law 2014; and state when he expects an inspection of these services to occur?”

5. The Minister for Infrastructure tabled an answer on 4th March 2024 to the following question asked by Deputy R.S. Kovacs of St. Saviour–

“Will the Minister explain the rationale for the proposed 10.1% increase to the cost of residential parking permits, as outlined in R&O.3/2024, following a recent increase in July 2023; and detail what consideration has been given, if any, to the impact these increases will have on those already struggling with the ever-increasing cost of living?”

- (b) provide a timetable for the introduction of the new guidance to schools, pupils and families of pupils;
- (c) state what training, if any, will be provided to teachers and school support staff;
- (d) describe any actions planned to ensure the families of pupils understand what their children are learning;
- (e) state what role, if any, the Jersey Curriculum Council (JCC) has had in the development of the guidance; and
- (f) advise whether there are any plans to make similar changes to the primary school PSHE education curriculum guidance?”

10. The Minister for Infrastructure tabled an answer on 11th March 2024 to the following question asked by Deputy D.J. Warr of St. Helier South –

“Will the Minister advise how much has been spent on maintaining the existing fire service and ambulance headquarters in the last 5 years, and state when a decision will be made to build new facilities at Rouge Bouillon?”

Attorney General state whether the synthetic cannabinoid 5F-MDMB-PICA is a controlled drug under the Misuse of Drugs (Jersey) Law 1978; and will he provide details of the 2 offences recorded in relation to this substance in the response to the Freedom of Information request entitled ‘Drug convictions in 2022 and 2017 to 2021’ that was published in December 2023?”

“Will the Minister state the total number of new psychoactive substances that have been added to the Misuse of Drugs (Jersey) Law 1978 since 2016?”

17. The Minister for the Environment tabled an answer on 11th March 2024 to the following question asked by Deputy D.J. Warr of St. Helier South –

“Further to the withdrawal of ‘Development of Town Masterplan’ (P.9/2023), and the comments on the proposition presented by the previous Council of Ministers, will the Minister detail what proposals, if any, the present Government has to develop a Town Masterplan; and if there are no such proposals, will the Minister explain why not?”

18. The Chair of the States Employment Board tabled an answer on 11th March 2024 to the following question asked by Deputy K.M. Wilson of St. Clement –

“Will the Chair detail the pay and terms agreement that has been reached with teachers, any matters that remain unresolved, and the timeline for ongoing discussions and a complete resolution to the situation?”



19. The Minister for Health and Social Services tabled an answer on 11th March 2024 to the following question asked by Deputy K.M. Wilson of St. Clement –

“Further to the recent major IT outage in the Health and Community Services Department, will the Minister explain –

- (a) what work, if any, is being undertaken to improve the quality of IT services in the department;
- (b) how many patient safety incidents were recorded as a result of the IT outage; and
- (c) what action, if any, is being taken to prevent a major IT outage recurrence?”

The report states that discretion may be exercised to allow for a longer speech than 15 minutes where the member speaking is designated as the 'main respondent' to the debate.
