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Report

Medical benefit is a subsidy paid from the Health Insurance Fund, to individuals, towards the cost of medical services provided by a General Practitioner in Jersey. The subsidy is a standard rate across all consultations. The Committee is proposing a £1 increase to take effect from 1st October 2002 in recognition of the fact that the cost of consultations has risen dramatically in recent years. This has led to some people, those with lower incomes and chronic ailments having difficulty in affording the medical care they require. The estimated increase in cost to the Health Insurance Fund is £380,000. There are no staffing implications.

Explanatory Note

These Regulations will increase from £12 to £13 the amount of medical benefit payable in respect of specified medical services provided by approved medical practitioners to persons who are exempt from liability to pay contributions under the Health Insurance (Jersey) Law 1967. The Regulations apply as from 1st October 2002.
