In approving 'Shadow Scrutiny: arrangements and approval of Chairmen and members', P.186/2003, on 20th January 2004, the States appointed members of the Shadow Scrutiny Panels, without stipulating which Panel each person would be a member of. Recently the Connétable of St. Mary has indicated his intention to resign because of pressure of work, and there is a need to appoint a further member to ensure sufficient numbers.

Deputy F.J. Hill, B.E.M. was formerly a member of the Privileges and Procedures Committee, and has a long standing interest in scrutiny matters. Senator E.P. Vibert has indicated that he will invite Deputy Hill onto the Shadow Scrutiny Panel he chairs.
