# DRAFT LICENSING (LICENCE FEES) (JERSEY) REGULATIONS 200-

#### REPORT

Liquor licensed premises pay an annual renewal fee at the required time of application, between 5th October and 5th November.

The Regulations setting the fees must be in place prior to 5th October so that the Treasury can collect the appropriate sums.

Over the last few years fees have been increased on an annual basis but purely to keep pace with inflation.

In these Regulations fees are increased by 2.5% over the existing. Fees were last increased in October 2003.

There are no financial or manpower implications for the States arising from the proposed Regulations.

#### **Explanatory Note**

These Regulations increase the prescribed fees for the grant or renewal of licences under the Licensing (Jersey) Law 1974 by approximately 2.5%. The fees were last increased on 1st October 2003.



## DRAFT LICENSING (LICENCE FEES) (JERSEY) REGULATIONS 200-

**THE STATES**, in pursuance of Article 11 of theLicensing (Jersey) Law 1974,<sup>[1]</sup> have made the following Regulations –

#### 1 Increase of Fees

(1) Subject to paragraphs (2), (3), (4) and (5), the fees payable on the grant or renewal of licences shall be as follows –

First Category ("Taverner's Licence")	£403 plus a fee of 98p multiplied by the maximum number of persons who may at any time be accommodated for reward on the premises (in these Regulations referred
Second Category ("Residential Licence")	to as "the number of approved residents") A fee of 98p multiplied by the number of approved residents, with a minimum fee of £125
Third Category ("Restaurant Licence")	£403
Fourth Category ("Comprehensive Licence")	$\pounds$ 1,005 plus a fee of $\pounds$ 2 multiplied by the number of approved residents
Fifth Category ("Club Licence")	£300
Sixth Category ("Off-Licence")	£105
Seventh Category ("Entertainment Licence")	
(a) cinemas, theatres	£403
(b) places of entertainment other than cinemas and theatres	A fee of 98p multiplied by the number of persons mentioned in the permit for entertainment granted by the Bailiff in respect of the premises, with a minimum fee of £403.

(2) If licences of different categories are applicable to the same premises, a separate fee shall be payable in respect of each category of licence.

- (3) If a licence will expire within 6 months of its commencement, the fee for the licence shall be one-half of that prescribed in paragraph (1).
- (4) If a licence will expire more than 12 months and 7 days after its commencement, the fee for th licence shall be increased by one-twelfth.
- (5) If an application for grant of a licence is refused or withdrawn, the amount of the fee shall be refunded to the applicant.

#### 2 Repeal

The Licensing (Licence Fees) (Jersey) Regulations  $2003^{[2]}$  shall be repealed.

#### **3** Citation and commencement

These Regulations may be cited as the Licensing (Licence Fees) (Jersey) Regulations 200- and shall come into force on 1st October 2004.
