# DRAFT SEA FISHERIES (MINIMUM SIZE LIMITS) (AMENDMENT No. 2) (JERSEY) REGULATIONS 200 

## REPORT

The current regulation defines Sole as Solea solea and specifies a minimum size of $24 \mathrm{c} . \mathrm{m}$. This only refers to ont species which occurs locally. The amendment seeks to broaden the definition of Sole to Solea spp which will include both the Common Sole and Sand Sole both of which are found locally. This will aid in the conservation of this species which is subject to considerable fishing pressure.
There are no financial or manpower implications for the States arising from these draft Regulations.

## Explanatory Note

These Regulations widen the definition of sole for the purposes of the minimum size of fish that may be retained.

## 1 Schedule amended

In Column 1 of Part 1 of the Schedule to theSea Fisheries (Minimum Size Limits) (Jersey) Regulations $2001{ }^{[2]}$ for "Sole (Solea vulgaris)" there shall be substituted "Sole (Solea spp)".

## 2 Citation and commencement

(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Sea Fisheries (Minimum Size Limits) (Amendment No. 2, (Jersey) Regulations 200-.
(2) They shall come into force 7 days after they are made.
