# DRAFT SUPPLY OF GOODS AND SERVICES (JERSEY) LAW 2009 (APPOINTED DAY) ACT 200-

#### **REPORT**

This Appointed Day Act will bring into force the Supply of Goods and Services (Jersey) Law 2009 which was adopted by the States on 8th September 2008. The Law received Royal Assent on 11th February 2009 and was registered in the Royal Court on 27th March 2009.

The Law is a major advancement in consumer protection in Jersey, as it clarifies contractual rights and responsibilities in statutory form. Whilst at present consumers in Jersey do enjoy a number of rights at customary law, they do not have 'statutory rights' in the strict sense that consumers enjoy in the United Kingdom. The Law sets out the full extent of such statutory rights and provides a clear framework for the benefit of both consumers and traders.

#### Financial and manpower implications

There are no financial or manpower implications for the States arising from the adoption of this Appointed Day Act.

### **Explanatory Note**

This Act brings the entire Supply of Goods and Services (Jersey) Law 2009 into force on 1st September 2009.
