## ORAL QUESTION FOR TUESDAY 19th MARCH 2024

Deputy K.L. Moore of St. Mary, St. Ouen and St. Peter will ask the following question of the Minister for External Relations –

"Will the Minister provide details of any representations that have been made by the Government of Jersey with regard to the inclusion of a permissive extent clause (Clause 12) in the UK's Safety of Rwanda (Asylum and Immigration) Bill; and if he has made no representation, will he explain why not?"

## Response (Provided in writing 19th March 2024 – ref: Standing Order 63(9)

The Bill began its parliamentary passage in the House of Commons in December 2023.

Following representations by officials, I confirmed to the Ministry of Justice on 5<sup>th</sup> February 2024 that Jersey did not seek the inclusion of the PEC in the Bill.

On 6<sup>th</sup> February 2024, the Minister for Home Affairs wrote to the Home Secretary seeking the removal of the PEC from the Bill.

I have also raised the matter with MPs and several members of the House of Lords, following which a number of supportive interventions were made on constitutional grounds during the passage of the Bill through the House of Lords.
