Background

Following changes, as from 1st January 1997, to the Public Finances (Administration) (Jersey) Law 1967, Article 18 allows the Finance and Economics Committee to allocate funds from the general reserve "where a Committee of the States' authorised revenue expenditure or any credit for capital expenditure is found to be insufficient to meet the demands made on it, or where a contingency has arisen or will arise which could not reasonably have been foreseen at the time of the submission of estimates under Article 15 of this Law."

The purpose of this report is to notify the States, in accordance with Article 18(6) of the Law, of any decisions made in respect of the granting of funds from the general reserve.

Granting of funds

Appendix A (attached) provides a summary of the funds which have been granted from the general reserve during 1999.

The total amount granted from the general reserve in the second half of 1999 was £5.8 million, bringing the total amount granted in 1999 to £13.8 million which is below the £24 million allocation for 1999. However, the residual balance of £10.2 million will be required for the additional cost of on-going capital projects, including the St. Helier surface water link and Haute Vallée School, land acquisition, additional funds which may be required for the States social security fund, crime and drugs strategies, and the cost of a number of new initiatives such as low income support.

All of the requests granted in 1999 have been subject to considerable scrutiny by the Finance and Economics Committee, and the Committee continues to constantly monitor the general reserve. It is only through the strong determination of the Committee that the requests for funds have been kept to a minimum.

Cash limits

Despite the constant reminders that Committees should not commit additional funds after having agreed their cash limits, the Finance and Economics Committee continues to be extremely concerned both at the level of funds allocated from the general reserve in 1999 and also at the number of requests still predicted for 2000. As Committees have agreed their revenue cash limits for the period 2000 - 2002, requests for additional funds from the general reserve will only be granted in the most exceptional circumstances.

Alternative options

Committee Presidents and States members continue to be reminded of the following alternatives which must be considered prior to the submission of requests for funding from the general reserve -

- existing services and funds should be examined and reprioritised;
- the generation of new sources of income should be considered;
- the vote transfer facility should be utilised.

Provisions

The Finance and Economics Committee is concerned that because of the uncertainty of certain Committee estimates, mainly the Employment and Social Security Committee, it has had to make provision for this in the general reserve rather than in the cash limits and as a result is currently unable to meet the target it set itself for reducing the annual allocation to the general reserve to £13 million (or 50 per cent of its 1998 level) by the end of 2001. However, the Finance and Economics Committee will continue to view unreasonable requests for funds from the general reserve as an indication that Committees are failing to adequately plan for the future within their cash limits.

Transfer of funds

In addition, the Committee must also advise the States of any transfer of funds between individual Committees' authorised revenue and capital votes in accordance with Article 18B(3) of the Law. Accordingly, details of transfers are shown on Appendices B, C and D, and are presented to the States for information.
