STATES OF JERSEY LAW 2005: DELEGATION OF FUNCTIONS – PHARMACY AND PHARMACY TECHNICIANS (REGISTRATION) (JERSEY) LAW 2010

REPORT

On 25th May 2010, the Minister for Health and Social Services made a Ministerial Decision delegating certain of his functions under Article 28 of the States of Jersey Law 2005 (MD-HSS-2010-0031, available at www.gov.je).

The terms of the delegations, and the legislation under which those delegations were made, were recorded in a Report attached to the Ministerial Decision, as shown below –

Chief Pharmacist – Delegation of Functions

Legislation:	Pharmacy and Pharmacy Technicians (Registration) (Jersey) Law 2010
Delegate:	Chief Pharmacist or nominated deputy
Function delegated:	<p>Article 2 – to keep and maintain a register of persons registered as pharmacists or pharmacy technicians;</p> <p>Article 6(1) – to register an applicant as a pharmacist;</p> <p>Article 8 – to issue a certificate of registration to a person registered as a pharmacist;</p> <p>Articles 9(3) and 10(1) – to cancel a person’s registration as a pharmacist;</p> <p>Article 17(1) – to register an applicant as a pharmacy technician;</p> <p>Article 19 – to issue a certificate of registration to a person registered as a pharmacy technician;</p> <p>Articles 20(3) and 21(1) – to cancel a person’s registration as a pharmacy technician.</p>
Scope of delegation:	<p>To only register a person as a pharmacist if the application satisfies the provisions of Articles 5 and 6;</p> <p>To only register a person as a pharmacy technician if the application satisfies the provisions of Articles 16 and 17;</p> <p>To only cancel a person’s registration as a pharmacist if the provisions of either Article 9 or 10(1) are satisfied;</p> <p>To only cancel a person’s registration as a pharmacy technician if the provisions of either Article 20 or 21(1) are satisfied.</p>
