RE: Follow up points from the public hearing

Thank you for your email on 10 November 2023 with questions that were raised during the Children, Education and Home Affairs Scrutiny panel review of the Proposed Government Plan 2024-2027. I write in response to these, please find the relevant information below.

1. The Panel noted that the Department for Justice and Home Affairs has a budget of £282,000 for Grants and subsidies in 2024, and that this was lower than the £370,000 which was budgeted for in 2023 (as per the last Government Plan figures). The Panel asked why this provision had reduced. The Chief Officer advised that this might have been due to a one off payment in 2023 but that this would be confirmed. From initial verbal response, there appeared to be some discrepancy in the figures, therefore, I'd be grateful if you could provide any clarifications about numbers in the response, if required. 
The change is within the Building a Safer Community (BASC) budget. The overall budget for BASC remains at £295,000, but £58,000 is now categorised as staff costs and £30,000 is now categorised as other operational expenditure, which is related to the development of the new BASC Framework. This leaves £207,000 for actual grant payments from BASC.

JHA is also the 'home' of the grant to Jersey Action Against Rape which was agreed in year, and funding for this will be shown separately.

2. It was confirmed that a copy of an updated structure chart of the States of Jersey Ambulance Service could be provided to the Panel. (Webcast timestamp: circa 28 mins 55 seconds).

Please note that, following consultation with staff, some of the role titles have changed in the structure chart below, and need amending in a future version. We provide the tables below to give the panel the summary information, which was referred to in the hearing, and also provide

the number of posts (eg 20 Paramedics) in the structure chart. The title changes are: Operational Support Officers (in the table) are now PTS Manager and Head of Operational Support (in the structure chart).

The total expenditure from inception to current day is £50,000 (£31,000 2022, £19,000 2023).

6. Confirmation of definition of CFRMIS

During the hearing, the panel asked a question about the expenditure on CFRMIS for the States of Jersey Fire & Rescue Service. We have now clarified with the Chief Fire Officer that this is 'Community Fire Risk Management Information System', to be used in the Service's delivery of fire safety prevention and protection activity. It is, essentially, a management information and workflow management system for firefighters administering and delivering education, engagement, engineering and enforcement activities to safeguard people in the built environment.
