My preference is as follows:

- A) Legislate on the basis that the majority of drivers are law abiding intelligent drivers

## Comments

A)

- 30mph from Gorey to St Martins again is too low for the circumstances
- It is crazy that when driving at 30mph in St Clements and St Martins when one is prevented from using ones discretion under 40mph, all the side roads are permitted at 40mph where one is presumably required to use ones discretion.

C)
