The Big Wander Quiz 2022 is now open!

We are inviting islanders of all ages to explore and learn more about our beautiful Island and its democratic system by completing our walking quiz.

You can take part by using the Goosechase App, or by printing and completing this offline document and submitting via email to statesgreffe@gov.je. You have six weeks (23 August to 26 September 2022) to submit your answers to us; school-age participants can tag their school - the school with the most points wins!

Points are given for correct answers, accurate photographs taken, and for accessing specific locations. There are some trickier questions that will mean you **MUST** visit those places; for example, Parish Halls!

The Rules:

1. All answers and photo submissions must be original work, taken by the entrants. No third party may own or control any materials the photos contain, and the photos must not infringe upon trademark, copyright, moral rights, intellectual rights, or rights of privacy of any entity or person. The photographs must not contain:
 - Curse words
 - Offensive or extremist views
 - Images that attack, criticise or negatively focus on an individual or a group of people because of characteristics such as their age, disability, ethnic origin, gender identity, medical condition, nationality, race, religion, sex, or sexual orientation
 - Anything defamatory, libellous or illegal in another way
2. Under 16s need consent of a parent and/or carer.
3. Entries will not be accepted unless submitted via the official contest channels. Entries not submitted through the proper channel will be deleted. All decisions are final. The States Greffe reserves the right to disqualify any entry that is deemed inappropriate or offensive. Submissions will not be accepted after 17:00 on 26 September 2022.

St. Brelade

1. It has been the Parish Hall since 1947, but what did the great building in St Aubin used to be before that? (There are 2 possible answers, we will accept either!)
2. As well as the Parish Hall, St Brelade has another polling station during elections. How many car parking spaces are there at this community site?
3. In 2017, prisoners at HMP La Moye were given the right to vote in elections. But can you name the former Home Affairs Minister, then Connétable of St. Clement, who brought this idea forward?

St. Peter

4. Connétable W.P. Le Marquand opened the Police Honorifique de St. Pierre, but do you know when? Find the year on the wall of the Parish Hall.
5. There are two keys on the Parish crest for St. Peter. Can you name what either of them represent?

St. Mary

6. How many names are inscribed on the St. Mary's War Memorial?
7. The St. Mary's Parish Hall, the Parish School and it's outbuilding have the same paint job - white and blue. What's the number you get when you add up the three years that they were built?

St. Ouen

8. Louise Mary Gould was killed in 1945 by the Nazis; she had hidden a Russian slave worker but was found out. Her sister was Ivy Forster, the first women to become a States Member. There is a memorial to Louise in St Ouen near the Parish Hall, but can you name the concentration camp that she died in?

9. Get your most creative shot of St. Ouen's Parish Hall. (Take a photo and submit it with this form)

St. John

10. "At the crossroads by St. John's Parish Hall, take a look around - how many Parish Crests can you see? (Hint: There isn't one visible on the Hall itself!)"
11. Get over to the centre stone to win 1000 points! (Take a photo of you with the stone and submit it with this form)

St. Lawrence

12. You will have safely parked your car at the garden of remembrance, near the Parish Hall and Church; but what is the last name of Moignard's friends in the Garden? (Hint: I wonder if they were grumpy?)
13. Which Connétable helped to build St. Lawrence Parish Hall? (Hint: their name can be found on the wall of the Parish Hall)

Trinity

14. Which former Connétable of Trinity shares his name with one of the highest mountains in the UK?
15. There are 4 years displayed on the 2 buildings making up Trinity Parish Hall. When you add them together, what do they make?

St. Saviour

16. What does St. Saviour's parish crest represent? (3 words) (Hint: the 2nd word is 'of')
17. The home of the Lieutenant Governor used to sit on Halkett Place, until 1820 when it was moved. Where does the Lieutenant Governor live now?
18. Can you name the new Lieutenant Governor, due to start in October 2022?

St. Helier

19. "There were, of course, crowds on the pier and, as the soldiers came ashore, they were hugged and kissed. It was the most remarkable occasion of my life." These words of the Bailiff Alexander Coutanche, speaking about the Liberation of Jersey. He had one of the toughest jobs in the history of Jersey, but where will you find these words? (They are near the Parish Hall, take a photo with them and submit with this form)
20. Find the place where the Connétable works in St Helier. (Take a photo and submit it with this form)
21. Karl Marx, a famous German political writer, stayed in the 'Hotel de l'Europe' on Mulcaster Street when he visited Jersey. Now a Randalls pub & eatery, check in/take a photo outside this popular spot!
22. There's a secret 'V for Victory' in the Royal Square. Take your most creative photo with it!

23. Victor Hugo escaped from France in political exile against the reign of Napoleon III, but where in Jersey did he live (other than in a hotel!)? Get out to the spot now! (Hint - his name is on the building!) (Take a photo and submit it with this form)
24. Which rock, opposite his house, did Victor Hugo spend his days gazing at France?
25. How many anchors are there within the grounds of St Clement's Parish Hall? This is a tricky one!
26. Which year would you have found L R Hamel as Connétable and J C Godeaux and J F Etienne as Procureurs du Bien Public in St Clement? (Clue: have a look on the walls of the Parish Hall)
27. Which Bailiff of Jersey opened St Clement's Parish Hall on 20th November 1971?

28. Stand outside the front of Grouville Parish Hall. How many crosses can you see?

29. At the back of Grouville Parish Hall there's a sign missing a letter. Which letter is missing?

St. Martin

30. Who donated the plaque depicting St Martin's Patron Saint, now on the St Martin's Parish Hall wall?

31. Which former Connétable opened the old St Martin's school building in 1899?

32. What year did the former St Martin's School open as M&S?

33. Take a photo with the 2 things (they are next to each other!) on St. Martin's village green that were put in place to remember those who laid down their lives for our freedom.
